Herealed that the Sturket Access Subcommittee recommendations are due to the Task Force on August 22, and so the committee is on an aggressive timeline with its hearings

Duing the hearings, the committee will consider the various issues student face related to access from prospect through matriculation

The TaskForce at large must make recommendations with two overarching considerations Compliance with SACS and professional acceditation standards and seamless continuity as a preeminent research university.

Chair Frazierre called that the Student Access subcommittee has been asked to focus on

Equitable distribution of programs and resources to establish pathways to admission for all students who require bridge programming and financial aid, and

pequevere looking or work. While some of the drallengs adults face overlap with those of First Time in College students – affordability, social/emotional—the drallengs require different strategies for adults. Adultionally, many adult students are not eligible for financial aid because they often go to part-time. She also discussed the idea of College Level Equivalency Program (CIFF) and Prior Learning Assessments can be padult learners by giving the more difforwork experience.
