
Today is Day 22 of the 60-day legislative session. e House and Senate are well underway in formulating their respective budget proposals. After each side has debated and passed their own spending plan, the leaders of each chamber will appoint a "Conference Committee" whose job is to negotiate a compromise between the two chambers' budgets. e compromise product from the Conference Committee will be the "General Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2011-2012" or the o cial state budget for next year.

Currently, the Senate is proposing to spend roughly \$240 million more in higher education

(including student tuition payments) than the House. e vast majority of this di erence is in lower House proposed spending on State Universities, since universities constitute upwards of 60% of the state's overall higher education spending. 



SB 234 BY SENATOR EVERS (R-**BAKER) AND HB 517 BY REPRE-**SENTATIVE DORWORTH (R-LAKE MARY) RE: FIREARMS

Latest Action: House Bill--On March 15th. the House Criminal Justice Subcommittee amended the bill to restore the current legal prohibition on bringing guns onto university campuses. e Senate Bill was similarly amended to restore this prohibition during an earlier meeting. Pending future amendments, this will be the last update provided on these bills as the current versions no longer have any e ect on state universities.

Latest Action: Approved as a committee bill by the House K-20 Innovation Subcommittee on March 22nd and led as HB 7151 on March 24th.
